History of Edward White & Emily Tomlinson White, Sarah Reay White, Elizabeth Hill White

1817 July 5th, Edward White was born at Bloxwich, Staffordshire, England to George White, a Tailor, and Elizabeth Tomlinson White, the family was living at Short Heath. His paternal grandparents were Solomon and Mary Snow White and maternal grandparents, Thomas and Mary Tomlinson (426,491). George and Elizabeth were married at Short Heath, Bloxwich, Staffordshire, England. Edward was christened on Aug. 18th, 1817. As a child he grew up along with his 4 brothers, Hyla (21 Mar 1819), George (22 Apr 1821 at Darlaston), Solomon (4 May 1823), and a sister, Mary Ann (15 Jan 1826).

Edward learned the trade of a bridle/cutter or maker as he grew, he was thin and short in stature.

1840 Edward's brother Hyla married Sarah Spink at West Bromwick (# match - XVIII698, Dec Qtr)

1841 July 11th, Edward's paternal grandfather, Solomon White, died from influenza at Bloxwich and his father, George, would probate the will along with his Uncle John Nicholes, on the last day of the year, Dec. 31st, 1841, in behalf of his grand mother Mary Snow White.

1841 Oct. 17th, Edward (of full age) aged 24 married Emily Tomlinson (spinster) age 20, living at Beech Lane at Stourbridge, Halesowen, Salop, England, witnesses were Thomas Baylis and George Fiddian. His new bride, Emily was born 31 Mar. 1822 at Wednesfield, Staffordshire, the daughter of John and Sarah Tomlinson (labourer)(844,905)

1842 Jan. 9th, First daughter, Edward and Emily, named Elizabeth was born at Norton Street, Birmingham, All Saints, Warwick (Certi).

1843 Oct. 29th, William Oliver was born at Herbragai's Building, Norton Street, Birmingham, All Saints, Warwick (Certi) Oliver was also listed in the Handsworth Staffordshire parish as the new son of Edward (a bridle cutter) and Emily (426,556).

1847 June 22nd, Edward was present at the death of his Emily who died of Phthisis (tuberculosis), at the age of 25 years in the Tilsleys Building, Carver Street, Birmingham. Warwick (Certi).

1847 Dec. 21st, Edward's father, George, died at Bloxwich, a widower at age 53 years old (096,786).

1848 Mar. 6th Edward and his brother George (both bridle cutters on Carver Street, Birmingham) administered their father George's (late of Bloxwich, Staff.) estate from the Lichfield probates (086,981).

1849 Feb. 12th Edward's sister, Mary Ann married Francis Platt, also a saddler, (age 23, resident Monument Lane, at St. Phillips Church, Birmingham (Certi).

1849 Sept 28th, Edward's brother Hyla died at Smethwick, Worcester, leaving a young widow - Sarah Spink White with three young children, Mary Ann (22 Aug 1841), George (9 Feb. 1844), and Albert (22 Mar. 1848). At the time of Hyla's death, their brother George was living with Hyla and George promised Hyla that he would look after the widow and children.

1850 The whole White family was a religious family and it is believed they may have been a member of the Baptist Church. The George & Lilpha Ackerman family joined the Mormon faith, as it was then called, and in meeting with the White family, Edward was converted. The White family accepted the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints beliefs which the missionaries taught. Edward was a very religious man and was one of the first to join the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints (Mormon) at Birmingham in England. He did missionary work in the village where he was born.

1851 Jan. 10th Edward White and Sarah Spink White (Hyla's widow who was born 1816 at Bloxwich), are listed on the LDS Branch at Birmingham, as both were re-baptized by P. Tame and Edward was confirmed by E. Bridges, Edward is listed as a bridle cutter. Edward was previously baptized by George Ackerman (086,981 & 415,456).

1851 Mar. Edward baptized his brother George into the LDS Church (1,750 725).

1851 Mar. 30, Sunday, Census (087,306, Sec 298 Page 38), living at #136 St. Vincent Street, Harborne, Birmingham, Warwick lists: Edward White, head, a widow, 33 yrs old, born Walsall, Staffordshire, with his children; Elizabeth, dau., 9 scholar; William Oliver, son, 7 scholar. No occupation was listed for Edward. It seems that Edward and brother George stuck together, as George is listed as brother-in-law, at Hyler's widow, Sarah's home at 20 Grove Lane, also in Harborne, Birmingham.

1851 June 1, William Oliver, 7 years died of Phthisis (tuberculosis) which he had for 6 months, at Bloxwich, Walsall, Staffordshire, Edward's hometown (Certi).

1852 Mar. 2nd, Edward - a bridle cutter at age 24 (really 34) a widower, married Sarah Reay, 23 years old, (actual 35) at St. Vincent Street in Birmingham, Warwick, England (Certi). Sarah Reay was born June 6, 1817 to Samuel Reay - a locksmith and Mary Taylor Reay at St. Thomas, Bloxwich, Staffordshire (291,664). One of Sarah's brother didn't want her to marry Edward as he didn't think Edward was good enough for his sister. Sarah Reay was working as an unmarried servant, age 32, as a cook, at the Church Road Deaf and Dumb Foundation at Ebgbaston, King Norton, Warwick at the 1851 Census (087,459).

1852 Mar. 22nd. Brother George was said to have left a sweetheart he planned to marry and instead married the widow of Hyla White - Sarah Spink White at King Norton to fulfill his promise to Hyla (# match Jan Qtr. 6c461).

1852 March 26th, Again, Edward re-baptized his brother George and new wife Sarah White at the West Bromwich branch, in Birmingham (087,038).

1852 Nov. 25th, Daughter Sarah was born on Rawlins Street, Birmingham, Ladywood (by Tanworth-in-Warden) Warwick, England. Edward is still listed as a bridle cutter (Certi).

1853 May 2nd, Edward is ordained an Elder by E. Randall at Birmingham, Warwick (086,981).

1855-1856 Edward is listed as a shopkeeper at 4 Rawlins Street, 60 Ruston Street North, in the Birmingham directory (942.4E4W).

Edward moved to London and was listed at the Holborn Branch coming from Birmingham (cut off from branch records 7/55) to reside at 79 Berwick Street (087,003), which was a turning off of Oxford Street, West, right in the heart of London.

1857 Aug. 11th, Daughter Martha was born at 79 Berwick Street, St. Anne's, Westminster, London, Middlesex, England. Edward had acquired the title of Bridlecutter (Journeyman)(Certi).

1858 Feb. 10th, Edward's sister, Mary Ann, set sail on the ship "Ellen Marie" with her husband Frances Platt and daughter Mary E. and sailed for the USA (087,038).

1858 May/June 24th Edward's sister, Mary Ann W. Platt died while crossing the Plains and was buried about 8 miles west of Kansas City, Missouri, leaving a 3 year old daughter, Mary Elizabeth, to continue on with her father, Francis Platt Jr. (086,981). Edward decided he wouldn't come to America. He said "One can live their religion in England." "The English folks tell their children what to do, but in America the children tell their parents what to do' so the Duke of Windsor said when he came back to England". "I'm not taking my wife to die on the trail!"

1859 June 5th, According to the Holborn Branch records, Edward is still living at 79 Berwick Street, Go Cart Street and his brother George's (ordained an Elder at Holborn) records arrive from Smethwick, Staffordshire and George is living at 2 Healthy Home, Berwick Street, Soho, Middlesex, England (087,003).

Together Edward and George established a joint fine saddlery harness business in the Haymarket, which is a very well known street in the west end of London. It has been stated that they displayed the 'Crown of England' over their shop which symbolized that they were saddler's to the King and Queen of England and well to do people. Business was profitable and they began a savings account with the London Building and Loan company, which later failed causing the White family to lose about 5 thousand pounds.

1860 Jan. 29th, George's family church records arrived from Birmingham to the Holborn Branch including: Sarah, Mary Ann, George and Albert (087,003).

Around this time frame it appears that Sarah became sick with bronchitis and needed extra help in caring for the little girls, so the family may have engaged the help of a young girl assumed to be Elizabeth Hill.

Extensive research for the 1861 Census for Edward/George's family at 79 Berwick Street proved that another family was there, (542,566 9/61, Folio. 7 pg 66 #63). The surrounding areas has not been able to locate either family, nor has his name been located in any London P.O. directories. Twenty seven districts have been researched on films, internet images searched and researched with no results. It is assumed that Edward's and George's two families were missed being enumerated or the records have been lost or destroyed as sometimes happened. However located at the following address of **5 Meards Court**, we find the James & Winfield Walton family with daughter Elizabeth would later become Edward's 3rd wife.

1861 Apr. 7th, Sunday Census: St. Ann, Westminster, London, Soho at **5 Meards Court** W17F: James Hill, married, 30, head, travseller to an Ironmonger, born at Birmingham, Winfield, wife, 30, born at Birmingham and Elizabeth, dau, unmarried. 16, waistcoat maker, born Middlesex, St. James (542,586 pg 26).

Less than 2 months later, Elizabeth gets a new little brother who's birth certificate reads: 1861 June 15th, James William Hill was born at **5 Meards Court**, Soho, St. Ann's, Middlesex, father as James William Hill a commercial traveller, and Elizabeth Hill formerly Walton. (Certi). James is the little brother whom upon the death of her parents before 1866, would be raised by Elizabeth and her future husband, Edward White.

1861 July 7th, Edward is listed at Somerstown LDS Branch located by Camden Town (087,032).

1861ish Sarah and Martha spent a lot of their childhood in St. James Park, W and went to St. James School, Piccadilly, West.

1862 July 1st, Brother George's family records from Holborn was received into the Somerstown branch, still living at 2 Healthy Home Berwick Street, Soho; George - an Elder, Sarah, Mary Ann, George, Albert (087,032).

1862-1865 The family apparently moved into 5 Meard's Court area which was occupied in 1861 by Elizabeth Hill's family as later verification proves.

1864 Apparently Edward White and Thomas Myring purchased a leather shop from John Buckland - leather dresser at 15 Lisle St. Leister Sq W. who was listed at that address in the 1864 London PO directory.

1864 Feb. Sarah Reay White made an embroidered sampler stating "Sarah Ray December" and her daughter Sarah embroidered "Sarah White Feb. 1864".

1864 Aug. 19th, Edward received a letter addressed to him in London from Frances Platt, Jr. who listed himself as a brother-in-law (086,981).

1865 Aug. 12th, Sarah Reay White dies at the age of 46 (actual 48) of Bronchitis at **5 Meards Court**, St. Anne, Soho, Strand, Middlesex with Edward present (Certi).

1865 Address in the 1865 London PO directory shows Edward still a Bridle Cutter working with Thomas Myring at 15 Lisle Street-Leicester Square West, London. It has been said that he had 14 men working for him.

1866 Edward's work still listed in London PO directory and same address as 1865.

1866 Nov. 19th, Edward (Saddler) at age 39 (actual 49) son of George White, tailor, marries Elizabeth (Betsy) Hill, age 23, daughter of James Hill, Travelor, both residing at **5 Meards Court**, Strand, St. Anne, Westminster, Middlesex, in the presence of William Walton and Harriet Green (Certi).

Records have indicated that Elizabeth was born 26 Dec. 1842/43 at St. Ann Middlesex, and LDS Church records state: 'Elizabeth Hill White, born Dec. 26, 1842 was baptized at Pentonville Baths' (415,456)

1867 March Edward and Elizabeth's first girl, Betsy White was born at Soho, registered at Strand (Mar. Qtr. 1b570) Following English tradition, of naming the first girl after the mother, they named her Betsy (086,981).

1868 Feb. 17th, During the Somerstown Branch London/Birmingham conference, Edward - an Elder, Betsy (wife) and Sarah were rebaptised by Elder H. Debenham and confirmed by Heber Young at London. Betsy was confirmed by Wm Hughes (087,032).

1868 Feb. 23, Betsy was blessed by W. Hughes, at Somerstown Branch by W. Hughes. (087,032 & 086,981).

1868 Early Edwards brother George, decided to immigrate to the US so Edward and George sold their business to help George finance his emigration expenses. According to the PO London directory to King Robert Kingcare & Henry and Co. Edward is not listed as an owner. Leaving from the Holborn Branch, George left for the USA aboard the "Colorado" which sailed July 14, 1868 with George White 47 Bridle cutter, Sarah (Spink) White 52, Mary Ann 26 (30 May 1842), George Jr. 24 (Feb. 9, 1844), Cecelia 22 (George's future wife Cecilia Emma Miller), Albert 20 - a Priest (22 Mar 1848), Sarah Jane 15 (Sept 25, 1852), Alice 13 (Jan. 8, 1855), Edward Orson 10, (Aug. 17, 1857) Elizabeth 9 (Feb. 8, 1859)(087,032 & 086,981 & 087,459 & 415,456). Elizabeth said her father, George, delayed their move to the new world so that she could be baptized into the Mormon church before they left. The family arrived in New York July 28th, and apparently paid \$305.15 for their fare and had 180 pounds of luggage and their own conveyance from the New York terminus (087,459). The family crossed the plains from Omaha to Salt Lake City, 1,000 miles, in ox wagons but the children walked most of the way. George and 20 yr old son Albert, loaded personal belongings in a hand cart and followed the ox teams, pushing the cart and walking the entire distance. George was so cheerful and although his wife Sarah (Spinks White) was rather a haughty person, they soon built a home at 525 2nd Ave. SLC. They were all happy to be with the Latter Day Saints and as there were no temples in England, they could do temple work. George continued work as saddle/harness making along with his son Albert, worked for Jenkins Saddlery on the corner of State Street and 1st South. George was always happy and made others so by merely being in his presence. He loved to spend time in his garden and when his work was over he would change his clothes, black his shoes (an old English custom) clean his finger nails, sit around talking to the folks.

1868 June 5, Their second daughter Alice Mary was born and birth Registration in District Westminster, St James. Birth in the sub-district of St. Anne Soho, in the county of Middlesex. Fifth June 1868 at 5

Meard's court, Alice Mary, girl, Father Edward White, mother Betsey White formerly Hill, Occupation of Father, Bridle cutter, Journeyman, X The mark of Betsey White, Mother, **5 Meard's Court**, Soho. Registered Seventeenth July 1868, Registrar Co. G. Chugham Deputy.

Alice was blessed in the Somerstown LDS Branch on July 15th, 1868 by Elder Heyhes (087,032 pg.47 & 087,015).

Elizabeth was a good cook and taught her daughters how to cook. At Christmas time she fixed the traditional goose and always had Plum Pudding. She would decorate the top of the pudding with Mistletoe and carry in the pudding with the brandy in flames in the English traditional way.

The family was a very social family and got together for many parties.

1869 March 30th, Church records received at the Lambeth Branch, Surrey, from Forrest Hill show the membership of Edward, Betsy, Sarah, Martha and Alice (087,008).

1870 Rosina Emily was born into the family according to 1871 census.

1871 Feb. 18th, Little Betsy, age 4, died at **5 Meard's Court**, Westminster, of Marasmus (Low protein starvation), certified, Edward is a Journeyman Bridle Cutter.

1871 Apr. 2nd, Sunday Census at St. Anne Soho, Westminster, Middlesex, Strand London show the family living at Meards Court, Westminster, London with

Edward White, head, 43, Briddlecutter born Walsall, Staff.;

...Betsy, wife, 25, born St. Ann Westminster; Middlesex

...Sarah dau 18, Briddlestitcher, born Birmingham, Staff.

...Martha, dau 13, scholar born at St. James Westminster, Middlesex

...James, son, 9 scholar, born at St. Ann Soho, Middlesex

...Alice Mary dau 2, infant, born at St. Ann Soho, Middlesex

...Rose Emily dau 9 mo infant born St. Ann Soho, Middlesex as composing the family members (823,293 10/144 Folio 67, pg 68).

1871 Apparently Martha did not care for her new step-mother Elizabeth as she was quite a common type person. Martha stayed often with her friend Hetty Drewett because Elizabeth would pull Martha's hair, and was apparently fond of the drink, which always kept Edward poor. Edward was in great demand in those days, he belonged to various clubs and they liked him as chairman so he went out frequently to dinners and the theater on complimentary tickets which he often took his daughter, Sarah, with him. He was a real gentleman, short in stature, quiet, having very nice ways and was considered a real gentleman. Edward was

a very well educated man for his time. He collected a large library of English literature and taught his children to love to read. He often read to them and helped them with their school work.

1872 July 21st, Somertown Branch Church records removed the names of Edward, Betsy and Sarah to Croydon Branch, Surrey. Edward is listed as an Elder (087,032 pg 36, 025,694).

1872 May 17, Ada Francis was born while living at 45 Albert Road in Beckenham, Kent (Cert)

1873 It appears that Martha was rebaptised (re-commitment ordinance) 26 July 1873 at Cold Bath Square by W. Jones and confirmed by J. West (087,032 & 086,981 pg 43, & 415,456).

1874 Aug 18th, Florence Maud was born at 45 Albert Road, Beckenham, Kent (Cert), and was blessed on 1874 Sept 20th, during the North London conference by E. Adams (087032 pg 62)

1877 Jan. 1 Minnie Louisa was born at Penge, (assumed registered at Bromley, Kent, March Qtr. # 2a382) and was blessed on 11 March 1877, North London Branch (087,032).

1877 June 3, Alice Mary was baptized by W. Paxman and confirmed by C. Morton, at Pentonville, Somerstown Conf. (087,032 & 086,981).

1878 Aug. 18th Florence Maud birth was at 45 Albert Road, Beckenham, Kent, (Cert) As Florence grew up her father often referred to her as being just like her Aunt Rachel!

1879 Mar. 15th, Minnie Louise just 2 years, 10 weeks died from Diphtheria of 19 days, exhaustion, certified in the presence of Edward White, Father, present at the death at 45 Alexandra Cottages, Beckenham, Bromley, Kent.

1879 June Qtr. Edward George (Teddy) birth was registered at Bromley, Kent (Jun Qtr. # 2a376)

1880 May 23rd, The Lambeth branch records show Edward, Betsy, Sarah, Martha, Alice. (087,008) N. London Branch records show Edward, Betsy, Sarah, Martha, Alice Mary from the Lambeth Conference Birmingham records (087,023) all being baptized (381,037).

1881 Apr. 3rd, **Sunday Census** of Camberwell, Lambeth, Surrey Borough, St. Luke show the family living at 40 Grenard Road. Family consists of

Edward White, md, 63, Bridle cutter born Bloxwich, Staff.

....Betsy, md, 56 bn. St. James, Westminster, Middlesex

....Sarah, umd,. 29, Clothing machinest saddle horse, born Birmingham, Staff.

....Alice dau, 12, Scholar, born St. Ann Westminster, Middlesex

....Rose, dau., 10, Scholar, born St. Ann Westminster, Middlesex

....Ada, dau,. 8, Scholar, born, Penge, Surrey

....Florence dau., 6, Scholar, born Penge, Surrey

....Edward George, son, 1, Scholar, born, Penge, Surrey (1,371,162 fishe).

Martha was at her friend Hester "Hetty" Drewett's house where she was a domestic servant.

1881 Census: James White 17, Male born Westminster, Middlesex, England at 124 & 136 Pimlico Rd, Chelsea, London, Middlesex, England (This is the only James White born in Westminster in all of the 1881 Census. He should have been 19 years old at the time (CD1,341,017))

1881 May 6, Emily Jane (Dolly) was born while the family was living at 40 Grenard Road, Peckham, St. George, Camberwell, Surrey (Certi). LDS Lambeth records show the arrival of Emily Jane, the daughter of Edward and *Emily T. White, (Edwards first wife's name)* blessed by Elder Tucker on 14 Aug. 1881 (087,032 & 087,008).

Florence decided that she did not like public schools and was not going to go anymore. Ada enrolled her in a private school which Florence really liked. This was fine for the first week, but then Ada was informed that she needed to bring money for the next weeks fees. When she asked her mother for the money the story came out and Elizabeth said, "Well I guess that is alright" and gave her the money.

1881 Aug 14th, Emily Jane was blest at the Lambeth Branch by Elder Tucker (087008).

1882 July Lambeth Branch Membership list has Edward, Betsy, Sarah, Martha and Alice Mary (#087008) all listed at the Birmingham conf. (087,032)

1883 July 14th, Alma Daisy was born at 31 Grenard Road, Peckham, St George Camberwell, Surrey, and was blessed by Elder Atkins on Sept. 16th 1883, at the Lambeth Branch, Peckham, LDS Branch (Certi).

1884 Lambeth Branch membership lists the same family members as in 1882 (087008)

1884 Aug. 10th, Martha, age 26, marries Frederick Charles Bush (a cook) age 25 at the family home at 31 Grenard Road, All Saints, Newington, Surrey. This marriage was witnessed in the presence of Edward White (father) and Sarah White (sister) of Martha (Certi). Frederick is the son of Samuel Bush, a publican.

1885 April 4th Sarah (age 32) married William Gulley Audritt at Parish of St. Giles in the Fields in the county of Middlesex. William was, 28, and a widower, Saddler, residence 28 Wild St.. Sarah White, 30, (she fibbed), Spinster, Machinist, in the presence of: Edward White and Alice Mills. (Certi)

1885 Aug. 10th, Elizabeth (Lizzy) May was born at 54 Grenard Road, Peckham, St. George, Camberwell, Surrey (Certi).

1888 Jan. 19th, Edward George, 8 years old, suffocated from partially digested food in the *gloths from vomiting, at 54 Grenard Road in Camberwell. Certificate received from Geo. Parceval Wyath, corner from Surrey. Inquest

held 23rd Jan. 1888 (Certi). *(epiglottis/the flap over the larynx which closes during swallowing to prevent food from entering the windpipe)

1888 Feb 8th, Albert Edward was born and was baptized at St. Luke, Camberwell, Surrey on March 16, 1888. It appears the family must have dropped from LDS Church records about this time, family still at 54 Gernard Road.

1890 Dec 25th, Rosina Emily White married William James Low at Parish of St. George Camberwell. William was 24, Bachelor, Toymaker, Residence at 4 Cator Street, Rosina Emily White, 20, spinster, Residence 54 Grenard Road in the Presence of: Charles Eldridge, Henry Warr, Florence White, Ada White.

1889 Sep 1st, Oscar Frederick was born and baptized at St. Luke on Sep 1st, Camberwell, Surrey, family still residing at 54 Gernard Road.

Edward was a very refined gentleman and made his trade in leather workings all of his life. Rose mentioned that Edward was next in line to be Lord Mayor of London but Elizabeth was quite a draw back to him. He passed away before he was either appointed or voted into the position.



Alma became deaf from the results of the childhood measles, but still loved to travel. Alma never married. She immigrated to the U.S.A. She also lived in Boston area. 1930-1938 she was living in NY. In 1969 when the "Young" family with which she lived moved to California, Millbrae, or the San Francisco area, she went with them. He was a builder and he built her a room onto his home. When they had children she was told she needed to get her own flat, which she did, living at 200 Millwood, Millbrae, California, 94030 where she cared for herself. In 1969-1971 Alma filled out a family group sheet, sparingly for Alona S. Perkes which helped in identifying and piecing the family


