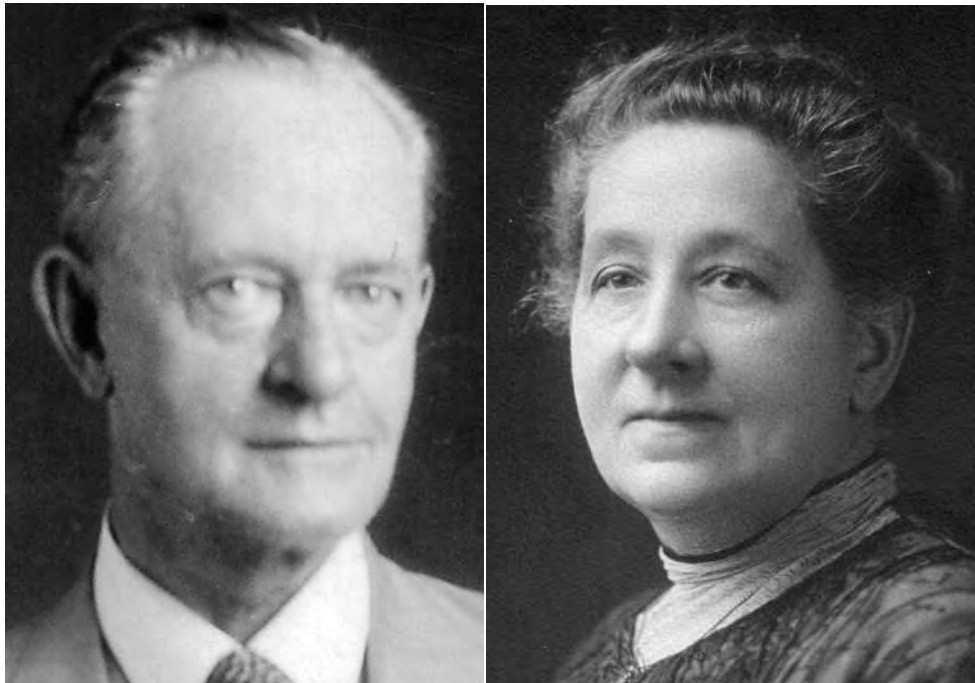

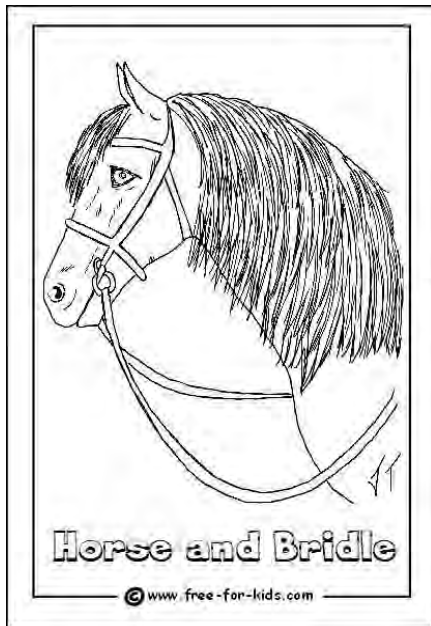
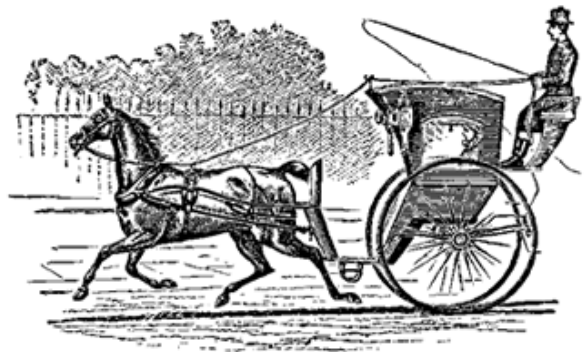

Frederick Charles Bush and his future wife, Martha White were born in London, England during the construction of the famous London Clock Tower.

They were still babies when the people of London heard the tower's big bell ring for the first time on May 31, 1859.

His father (Samuel Bush) was a horse-drawn taxi driver.



Her father (Edward White) was a bridle maker. Perhaps Samuel bought bridles from Edward.

But the two young people probably met each other at church. They were both members of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints (the Mormons).

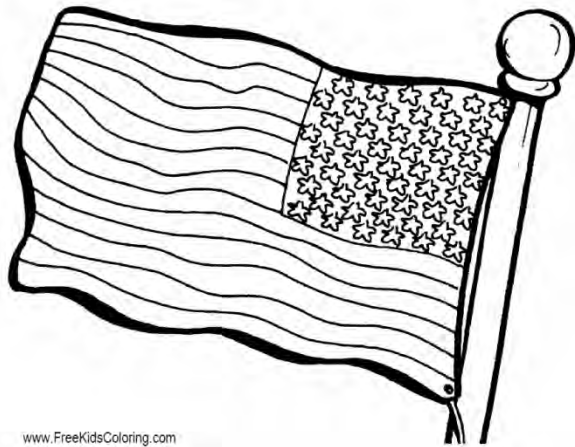
Frederick went to school to learn oil painting. He graduated from Oxford College in London.¹

He made his living as a painter most of his life.

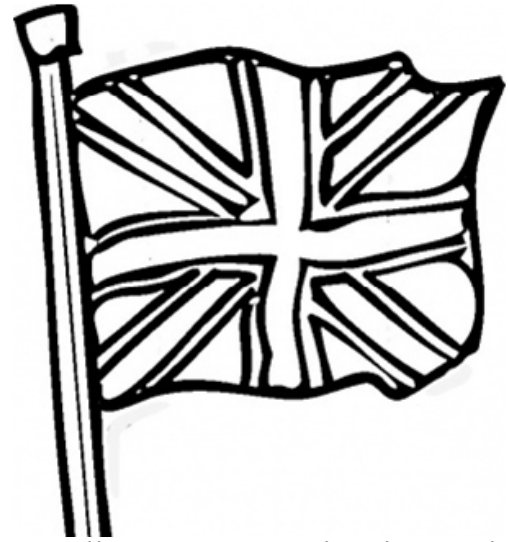

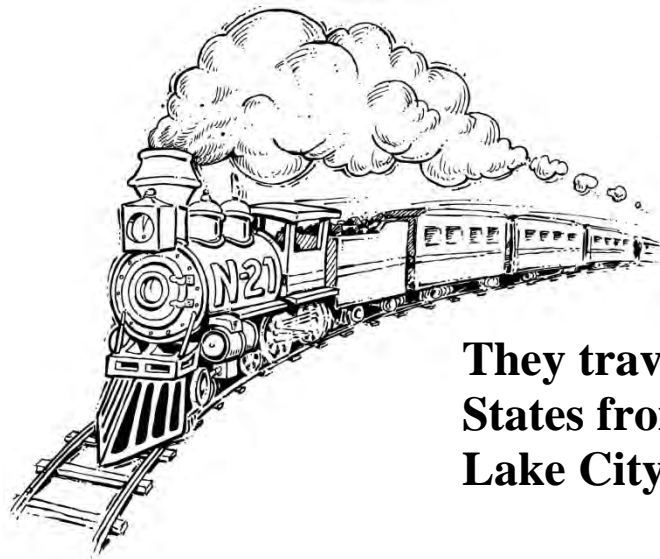
Frederick and Martha moved to America when they were about 35 years old. They had three children by then; two girls (May and Rose) and a son (“Holly”).²

They celebrated their emigration and Holly’s 5th birthday at the same time by putting flags on his birthday cake; an American flag and a British flag.³

They crossed the Atlantic Ocean in June 1893 on the steamship Arizona.

They traveled across the United States from New York to Salt Lake City by railroad.

² Frederick and Martha had 4 children: Clara Alice “May” 1885 – 1966, Samuel Edward “Holly” 1887 – 1949, Elizabeth Mahala Rose 1889 – 1975, and Florence Lilac 1895 – 1948.

They arrived in Salt Lake City just two months after the Temple was dedicated.

Fredrick got a job painting the temple. He was up on scaffolding when he and two other workers fell and got hurt.



He was on crutches for several years after the accident.⁴ He was only 5' 3" tall and walked with a limp the rest of his life.

He did all kinds of painting, including stage scenery for dramatic plays, a ceiling in the Church Administration Building,⁵ and framed oil paintings including many landscapes. His paintings were usually signed "F.C. Bush" and then dated with the year.

⁴ As soon as he was able, Frederick went to LDS Business College and studied draftsmanship. He got a job as a draftsman and plat maker at the Salt Lake City and County Building. Then he became a Real Estate Title Examiner and a Land & Title Abstractor for the Church's Presiding Bishop's Office.

⁵ Years later his painting on the ceiling of the Church Administration Building was painted over.

Martha learned the fine art of entertaining in England. She knew how to properly set a table.

She used pure linen table cloths and napkins. The goblets were crystal. She would provide colored sugar cubes for the tea and a candy stick to stir it with. She made little butterballs to serve with breads.

She made desserts fit the occasion. She molded ice cream servings into fancy shapes, such as Valentine hearts, Christmas bells, swans, butterflies, or fruit shapes.

When they held a party, they delighted in making people feel important. Fredrick would use the theme of the event to paint a personal invitation for each invited guest. He would also paint a place card for each person to mark where the guest was to sit at the table.

Sometimes she would host birthday parties or wedding receptions. She would bake cakes for the event and Frederick would decorate them beautifully.

Music was part of their home and their parties. May played the piano well. Holly had a beautiful baritone voice. Together they furnished music at parties and weddings.

Because they had limited finances, Martha and Frederick planned their entertainment carefully. They aimed to please and surprise their guests with wonderful foods, music, and fun.



When company arrived at one of their parties, Martha and Frederick would greet them at the door with a kiss. Frederick was a party live-wire. He would go around asking, “Everybody Happy?”

The Bush’s last big party was Frederick and Martha’s 50th Wedding Anniversary. Over a hundred friends and relatives celebrated with yellow decorations, music, and a big cake. The local radio station KDYL broadcast congratulations and played a special song.

Frederick was 80 years old when he died in August 1938. Martha died less than 3 months later. They were buried in the family plot at the Salt Lake City Cemetery in Utah.
