



When Reuben married Mary, he gave her a wedding ring.






When Edith was 2 years old, she got a baby sister, named Esther Ellen




They had a baby girl.

Reuben, Mary, Edith and Esther immigrated to America in 1868, leaving on the ship "Minnesota".






They took a train from New York to Fort Laramie, Wyoming.

They walked along side covered wagons from Laramie to Salt Lake City, Utah


