North Ogden, March 28, Ray W. Woodfield and Vera J. Campbell were united in marriage Friday in the Salt Lake Temple, and will make their home in North Ogden.

The groom is a son of Mr. and Mrs. John A. Woodfield. He was born here on November 8, 1901, and has resided here continuously except for a period of nearly two and a half years in the British Mission, from May 26, 1921, to October 3, 1923. He was given his infant blessing on January 5, 1902 by Patriarch James Ward, was baptized on June 5, 1910 by Thomas E. Orton, and confirmed by Frederick W. Ellis. He has been honored with all orders of the lesser priesthood - a Deacon on January 11, 1914, by David E. Randall; a Teacher to David E. Randall, and a Priest February 15, 1920, by William Gibson. On January 5, 1921, he was ordained an Elder by George E. Brown. He was given an education in the Weber County and Ogden City Schools, graduating from the country school course at North Ogden under Prof. John Q. Blaylock and receiving his diploma on June 3, 1916, from County Superintendent William N. Petterson. After he return from his mission he served in the Ward in the presidency of the Young Men's Association and as class instructor in the Sunday School.

The bride is a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Warren Campbell and was born at Liberty, Ogden Valley on November 17, 1903. She was given her infant blessing on February 7, 1904, by Bishop Joshau B.
